## Please Note:

- Dalton State encourages all students to take between 30-33 hours per year to graduate in four years. Dalton State offers a spring and fall nursing cohort.
- 2. Applicants must wait one semester to be eligible to apply after completing the ASN degree. Applicants must present licensure as an RN by the application deadline.
- 3. The Core Curriculum must be completed before being eligible to graduate with a BSN degree. Applicants may elect to complete some or all of the general education requirements in the core curriculum before applying for the RN-BSN. Classes taken as part of the general education core curriculum receive points on the admission worksheet for selection.
- 4. Program-accepted students will be required to complete clinical hours during the daytime, nighttime or weekends.
- 5. Program-accepted students must meet the following clinical requirements:
  - Completed Health History and Physical Form
  - TB Screening
  - Urine Drug Screen
- Nursing Department Immunization Form - Criminal Background Check
  - Other Health Screenings
  - Mandatory Health Professional CPR certification through the American Heart Association.
  - Students must maintain ability to meet requirements of Nursing Practice Performance Standards/Essential Abilities.
