Good Morning Everyone. Updates to the Student Code of Conduct, students are held accountable for actions as a Dalton State student on or off campus at Dalton State College Events. Definitions page has gone from one page to three. On page 3 more information on mandatory reporting, responsible employees, purpose of employees and so on has been added. A student and victim rights section has been added to our student conduct code as well as language for recusal and challenge of bias and included the role of the advisor. I have changed, altered, and expanded code violations. Animal violations, there have not been any problems but if arises the code of conduct is there. Identification card violations this addresses any student who takes someone else's roadrunner identification card and tries to buy something with it without your knowledge. Violation of confidentiality strictly for any students that serve on our student conduct board. If student serving on the board is caught speaking or talking about the case or case verdict outside of the board hearing will be addressed. Added language from Board of Regents addressing any false reports or statements made by a student. Updated Board of Regents policies for sexual misconduct. Updated hearing types, moving up from two types to three types. Updated and moved appeals duties to the following order Dr. Hall, Dr. Johnson, Dr. Venable, and option to appeal your case to the Board of Regents. Discussion on the current strategic plan for DSC: Review DSC mission, vision, and values, Review new USG mission, vision, values, and strategic goals. Next meeting will be in January.

b. Dr. Jodi Johnson, Vice-President for Student Affairs

- Enrollment updates: All growth within the University System is in Graduate programs, it is also in a small group of institutions, which include: GT, UGA, Kennesaw State, Middle Georgia. Georgia College. The State College sector is down 2% on average. Dalton State College is at 3% decline in enrollment. The change in demographics of High School graduates will peak in 2023, we will then experience a sharp 13% drop in enrollment. What this means, there will be fewer 18-23-year old students going to college. We will be looking at increasing our market to adult learners. Momentum year effort: our focus is to encourage students to take 15 credit hours a semester in order to graduate on time. Since 2015 we have increased that by 12%, getting more students to take 15 hours. Most of our students here now (2019) are full time students. Students taking face to face courses has declined across the system in enrollment. Students taking online courses is stagnated while students taking hybrid classes has increased across the system. In enrollment we have experienced an increase this Fall in our dual enrollment students. Our Hispanic or Lantinx student's enrollment is up to 31% as of this Fall. Our average age student is 22 years old. Our retention rate has dropped by about 4% last Fall. We awarded 817 degrees last year, 65% where baccalaureate degrees. Our graduation rate is up to 28%. Our numbers are improving. If you know someone on campus who is struggling or needs help, point them in the direction to the resources we have here on campus so we can get them on the right track.
