Although not vested with administrative decision-making powers, the Committee will advise the provost and vice president for academic affairs, director of institutional research, and deans/department chairs on ways to enhance the quality of academic programs and to assist in determining their ability to respond to future challenges and opportunities. The Committee will review all program reviews completed by the deans according to schedule and provide comments and suggestions for improvement. Information gathered in the course of program review will be used to evaluate strengths and weaknesses, determine future priorities, and thus assist in providing information for the decision-making process.
