4. Administrative Updates

- Dr. Jodi Johnson talked about the process of conducting a feasibility study on new housing and renovation of the student center.
 - Focus groups have been formed to discuss such topics and ask for student input. We have a lack of space in the student center for RSO's and Student Government. The state and University System of GA do not pay for non-academic space. The bill will be in the form of a fee. The lowest fee would probably be around \$100.
 - Faculty and staff met yesterday to discuss the budget and to decide where to make cuts. Some positions on campus will not be filled right now and faculty and staff will also take furlough days. Saves college around \$55,000 per furlough day.
- Nick Henry brought forth the news that raising the parking and transportation fee resulted in the approval of buying a new DSC van. The van should be here around Christmas time.
- Jami Hall took the floor to talk about the budget and the adjustments that had to be made. We are suffering an \$18,000 shortfall in the fall, resulting from lack of enrollment. She did not want to ask for RSO's to trim budget but she did ask for primary administrative units to take a hit on budgets.

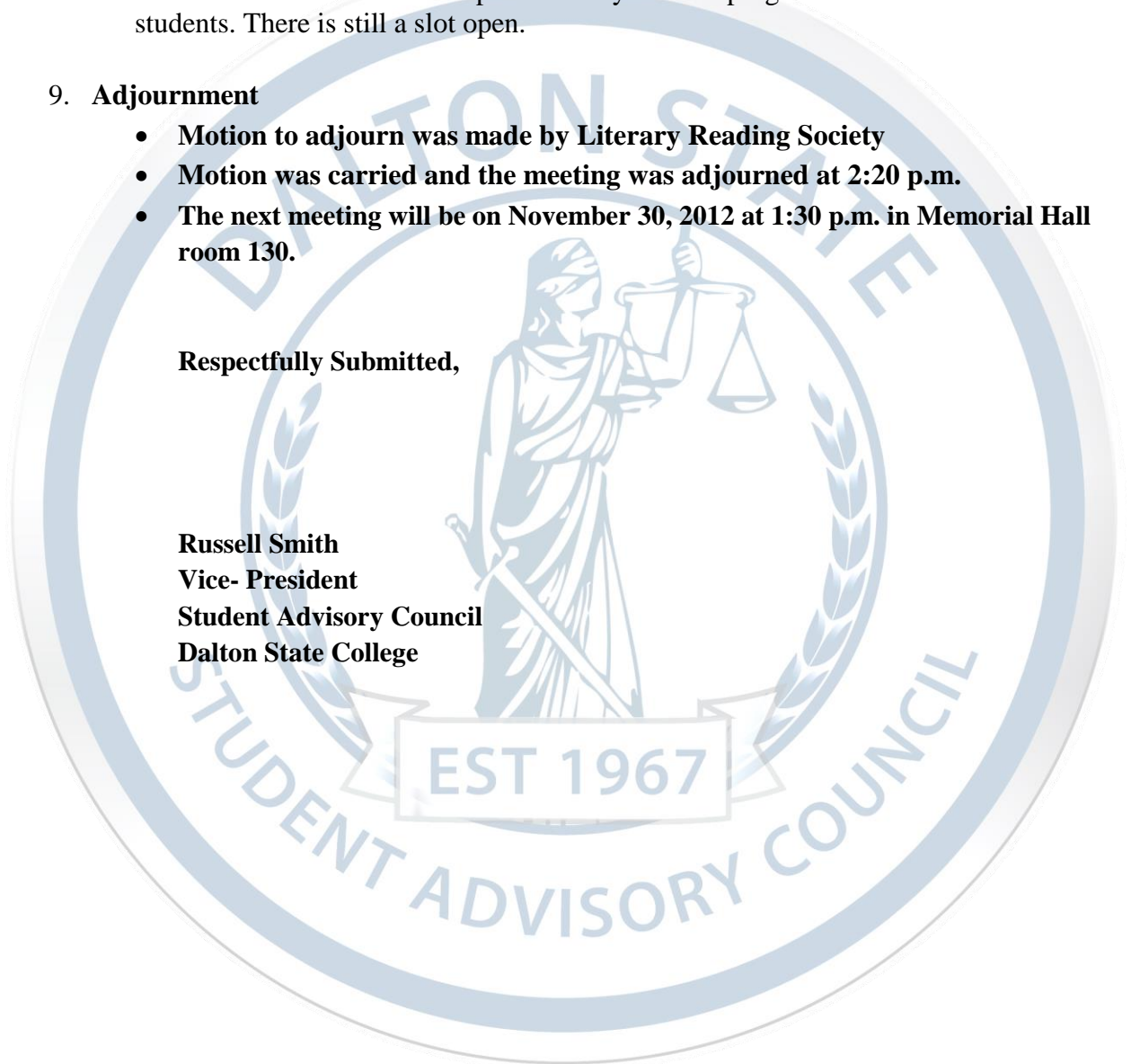

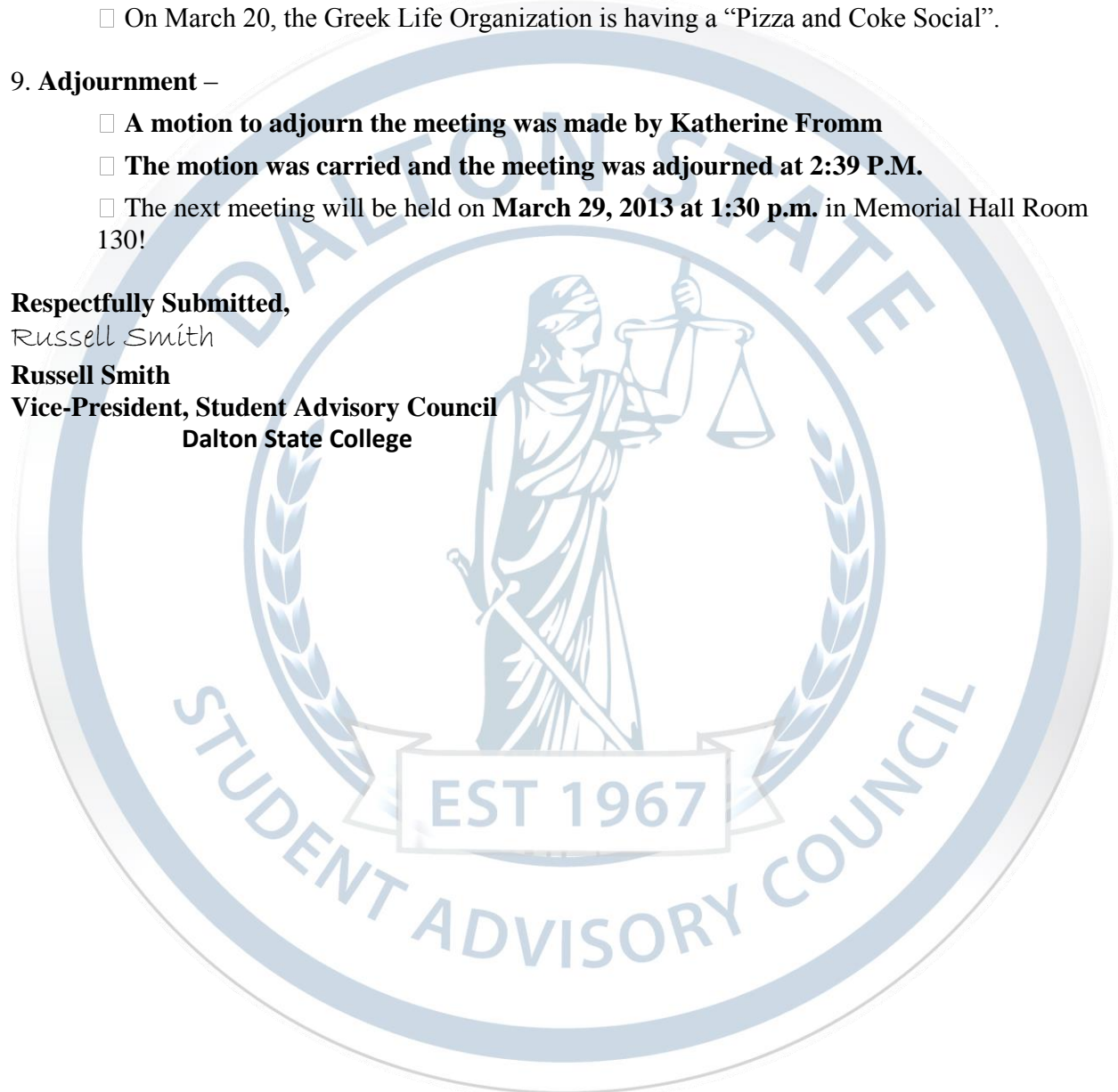

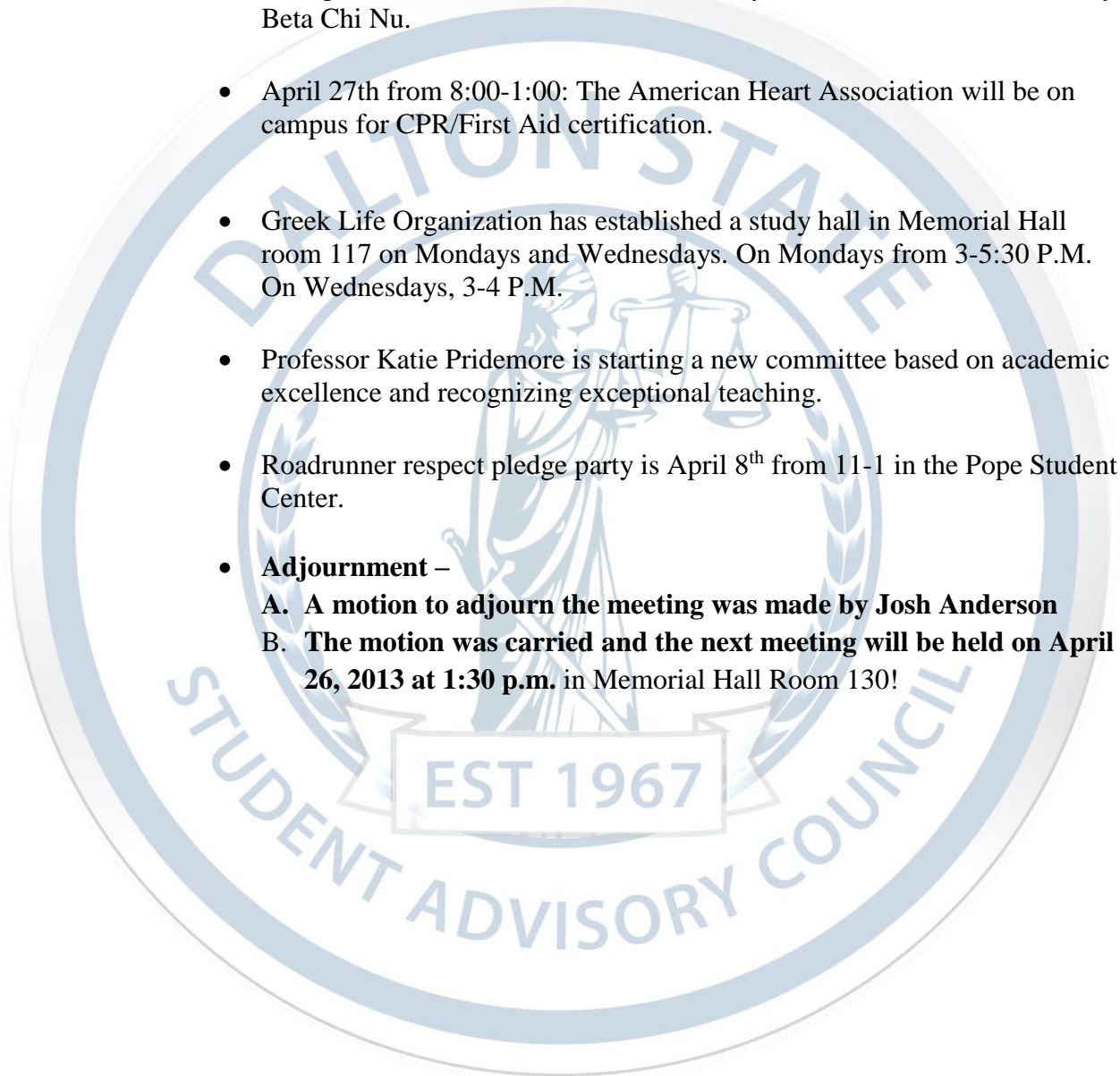
