## Program Pathway - Bachelor of Arts History

The Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in history is designed to produce graduates who have knowledge of U.S., world, and regional history. The degree provides students with skills in research, writing, communication, interpretation, and analysis and prepares them for employment in public history, government and politics, international relations, business, and the media, including journalism and editing. Students are also prepared to pursue graduate degrees in a number of fields, including history, philosophy, law, and the social sciences.

This map is a term-by-term sample course schedule. Highlighted courses have been identified as "key courses." Students are strongly advised to make every effort to pass these courses on the first attempt with a "C" or better in order to be successful in this program. The milestones listed below each year are designed to keep you on course to graduate in four years. Missing milestones could prevent you from being eligible for a particular program or could result in a delay in graduation. The Program Pathway serves as a general guideline to help you build a full schedule each term.

- If you are planning to pursue certification to teach grades 6-12, you should change your major to BA History with Secondary Certification. You should also complete COMM 1110 and PSYC 1101 with a C or better in your first year.

Also, consider job shadowing or interviewing professionals in the fields that you are most interested.
- Attend the Graduate Studies Fair and/or the Career Fair.

## Fourth Year Milestones

- Submit Graduation Application to Office of Enrollment Services
- Discuss History Internships with your advisor and/or Department Chair. If possible, complete HIST 4000 - History Internship this year. Note: HIST 4000 may be repeated up to a maximum of six credit hours.
- If planning to pursue graduate studies, you should submit application and supporting materials by advertised due dates. For most schools, these dates will be one year prior to the term of entrance.
- If planning to enter the job market after graduation, update your resume, practice mock interviews, and attend the Career Fair.
